

ROYAL MESSAGE FROM THE DUCHESS OF CORNWALL TO CELEBRATE AN EXTRAORDINARY YEAR FOR GIVIT

From bushfires, cyclones and floods to COVID-19, national online charity GIVIT is celebrating its 12th birthday by reflecting on the significant growth and impact the Australian-born charity has had in the past year.

Joining celebrations was GIVIT Patron, Her Royal Highness - Duchess of Cornwall, who began her first Australian charitable patronage after donating to GIVIT's Black Summer Bushfires appeal.

HRH the Duchess of Cornwall said she was delighted to have this opportunity – albeit virtually – to wish GIVIT a very happy birthday.

"For the past 12 years, GIVIT has been helping open-hearted people to, in your words, 'give the smart way'. Through your work, you have empowered local communities, ensuring that people get exactly what they need, when they need it.

- Welcomed former Olympian and Socceroo, Jade North, as GIVIT's Indigenous Ambassador
- Over 1,000 new groups joined GIVIT's national registered charity network.
- New record of 30,000 donated items coordinated weekly through GIVIT.org.au.

GIVIT Founder, Juliette Wright OAM says, "It's incredible to look back on how far GIVIT has come, and the fact we're celebrating our twelfth birthday with HRH! It took a decade to reach our first million donated items, so I'm very proud we've coordinated our second million in just 18 months and helped so many in need."

"We're so grateful to have the ongoing support of HRH, and after coordinating 1.1 million donated items in 2020 we're very excited to eclipse our three millionth donated item hopefully by Easter."

There are currently over 27,000 items requested on GIVIT.org.au for Aussies in need, whether recovering from a disaster event or experiencing hardship due to domestic and family violence, homelessness, disability, unemployment and mental ill health.
