#### Chairman's Letter...

GIVIT empowers local communities to request exactly what they require while providing generous individuals and businesses a safe, reliable and easy way to identify the real needs of those severely affected.



As GIVIT continues to build strong relationships with an increasing number of community groups, non-profits, frontline services and local councils we are consolidating the vital role we play in helping communities recover after major disaster events. By managing all offers of goods and services, GIVIT empowers local communities to request exactly what they require while providing generous individuals and businesses a safe, reliable and easy way to identify the real needs of those severely affected.

As someone who works as a volunteer for the Australian Red Cross supporting people affected by natural disasters, I see firsthand the impact GIVIT is having helping communities rebuild. The hope we give to people who have lost everything and are trying to reset their lives is as important as the donated item; the school shoes and school bag to help a single mum get her kids back to school; the clean mattress and sheets for an elderly man who has been sleeping on a bed covered in mould; or the fridge for a family whose child is on insulin that needs to be kept refrigerated.

Unfortunately this year saw Queensland hit by Tropical Cyclone Debbie with the impact felt from tropical North Queensland down to the flood-ravaged communities of northern NSW. We know that our most vulnerable are always the hardest hit by natural disasters and Tropical Cyclone Debbie was no exception. Working with 50 charities within the affected communities, as well as outreach teams from the Australian Red Cross and Department of Communities, GIVIT was able to provide more than 58,000 essential items.

This number continues to grow every day as we continue to support those who do not have the financial means to help themselves.

Unfortunately experts are predicting an increase in both intensity and occurrence of these tropical cyclones, with stronger winds and heavier rainfall such as we saw with Tropical Cyclone Yasi. A greater proportion of tropical cyclones may reach further south along Australia's east and west coastlines so we know GIVIT will be needed more than ever into the future.

I am really excited to see GIVIT's Recovery
Service move into the ACT and Western Australia
and our focus over the coming years will be to
embed our benchmark service into the recovery
mechanisms in both Victoria and New South
Wales. Our goal is that our homegrown, innovative
donation management system will become the
gold standard in all states and territories across
Australia.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all the wonderful GIVIT staff and volunteers who continue to work tirelessly to make GIVIT what it is today – especially in times of disaster.

A special thank you must go to GIVIT's Founder and CEO, Juliette Wright, who is an inspiration to us all. Juliette's passion for alleviating the effects of poverty and ensuring people in need get exactly what they need when they need it most has culminated in the donation of almost 500,000 items since GIVIT began.

## CEO Message...

As we finish 2016- 2017 financial year I want to extend a heartfelt thank you to all of our donors and charities. It is with your support that we have been able to continue to grow and it is for you that we continue to strive to improve.

In seven busy years GIVIT has matched 476,221 donations and supported 1,529 charities from Cooktown to the Pilbara, to Ballarat to Launceston and everywhere in between, matching over 164,000 donations and registering 417 new charities this year alone.

Our role, partnering with the Queensland Government, to support communities recovering from major disaster events continues to grow. Working closely with local governments, GIVIT is now an integral part of local Disaster Recovery Plans across Queensland, supporting communities to take a lead in their own recovery and request exactly what they require to rebuild their lives.

On 28 March, 2017, Tropical Cyclone Debbie crossed the Queensland coast and wreaked havoc on communities up and down coastline severely impacting communities from Bowen to Logan. GIVIT managed all offers of assistance and facilitated the donation of 58,181 items to people in cyclone-impacted areas throughout Queensland and several services supporting affected areas in NSW. We received \$317,000 in cash donations which allowed us to purchase essential items in impacted communities, to not only help individual families with the purchase of beds and whitegoods, but also to help stimulate the economic recovery of devastated communities.

Thank you to all our donors, both individuals and businesses, who provided support to those affected by the cyclone – we received significant cash donations from the Dowling Family Foundation, Queensland Country Credit Union, SC Johnson, Road Boss Rally, Aurizon and Best & Less, as well as large stock donations from IGA, Hanes Australasia and Reckitt Benckiser.

This year Queensland was also was rocked by a tragic incident at Dreamworld on the Gold Coast that took the lives of four people. GIVIT was asked to manage the official appeal. \$590,000 was collected and distributed to support the families devastated by this horrific event. GIVIT ran its first Kids in Care appeal with the Queensland Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services.

This highly successful appeal resulted in over 10,000 new toys being delivered to children in care for Christmas, bringing a huge wave of joy at an especially emotive time of year.

Thanks to the amazing support of our principal partner, IAG, we have been able to strengthen our Brisbane head office. This has included the appointment of a General Manager to oversee operations and ensure quality governance mechanisms are in place and all statutory and regulatory requirements are met.



I look back on the year with an amazing sense of pride – I am so proud of what GIVIT has achieved and I want to thank everyone in the GIVIT family for all their hard work and support.

Thank you to our partners—IAG, Bankwest Foundation, the Queensland Government, ACT NOWaste, Clayton Utz, and Road Boss Rally — without your ongoing support none of this would have been possible.

We are currently in the process of distributing 111,000 items of brand new stock to people in need thanks to an incredibly generous donation from Hanes Australasia. We look forward to continuing to build on this partnership in the years to come.

A huge and heartfelt thank you to all our wonderful staff, volunteers, board members, to all the social workers who took the time to find out exactly what is needed by their clients, the Road Boss Rally entrants for their ongoing support and help delivering donations and lastly to our wonderful donors – to all the people who gave money or items to make a real difference to the lives of someone they will never meet.

Our focus this year continues to be on building our national presence and raising our profile in order to attract more donors and charities.

In partnership with the Bankwest Foundation, we are actively building our presence in Western Australia; establishing Memoranda of Understanding with local councils to embed ourselves in their Emergency Recovery Plans; and building relationships with local charities and support services to meet the immediate material needs of their clients.

GIVIT secured an agreement with the ACT Government allowing us to establish a GIVIT office in the ACT with a dedicated ACT manager. This will allow us to implement GIVIT's highly regarded Emergency Recovery service, whilst also providing support for community service providers and ACT domestic violence shelters experiencing difficulties coordinating donations and transport logistics.

GIVIT also secured funding from the Queensland Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services to support a new Engagement Coordinator who will travel across Queensland encouraging charities to utilise the GIVIT service to meet the needs of the most impoverished members of their local communities.

I am still as overwhelmed today by the generosity of everyday Australians when a successful match is made as I was with the very first donation of the microwave oven seven years and 476,221 donations ago.





#### **Emergency/Disaster Recovery Service**

GIVIT's Emergency/Disaster Recovery Service is renowned in Queensland for supporting non-profits and local councils in meeting the material needs of their residents for the long-term recovery after natural disasters. GIVIT enables communities to take the lead in their own recovery by providing them with exactly what they need, when they need it most.

Our service includes support in recovery periods in both unexpected events such as the Ravenshoe Café explosion in north Queensland, large-scale events like Tropical Cyclone Debbie and single incident events like house-hold fires, without the need for warehousing.

In the past twelve months, GIVIT's strategic national rollout of its Emergency/Disaster Recovery Service has gathered pace. We have recurrent funding in both Queensland and Western Australia and most recently the Australian Capital Territory, and one pending submission with Emergency Management Victoria. It is truly exciting to experience the growth of GIVIT's reach and profile.

### **Impact**

#### **Humanitarian Support Program**

In March 2016, GIVIT partnered with the Australian Federal Government and settlement and community service providers to manage offers of assistance for newly arrived refugees, concentrating on the additional 12,000 Syrian and Iraqi arrivals seeking protection from conflict and trauma in their countries.

#### **Tropical Cyclone Debbie**


On 28 March 2017, Australia's east coast was hit with Tropical Cyclone Debbie. With wind gusts of up to 260 km/h and widespread flooding, GIVIT was asked to support local councils, frontline agencies, and community service providers in 12 local government areas up and down the Queensland and NSW coast – from the Whitsundays to Lismore.


Working with 44 organisations across Queensland, GIVIT identified exactly what local communities required. These included: Whitsunday Regional Council, Mackay Regional Council, Isaac Regional Council, City of Gold Coast, Logan City Council, Sunshine Coast Regional Council, Moreton Bay Regional Council, Department of Communities, Australian Red Cross, The Salvation Army, Lifeline, neighbourhood centres and other community service providers.

Working with local councils, GIVIT has been able to support residents impacted by the intense rain that accompanied the cyclone but were not entitled to state government assistance payments.

To the end of June 2017, GIVIT has provided 58,181 items, with the majority of requests being for water, generators, food vouchers, beds, linen, pillows, whitegoods, furniture, clothing and school supplies.

At its peak, six weeks after the cyclone, GIVIT's virtual warehouse contained more than 40,000 items donated from members of the public to assist people impacted by the cyclone. Unfortunately many of these offers were unsuitable, due to poor quality or distance from where the item was needed. GIVIT was able to match many of these items to other services located closer to the donors. 115,000+ items were offered by corporate donors across Australia, and whilst not all of these items








were suitable or wanted by affected communities, the majority have been received by affected households. Corporate donations included mattresses, linen, cleaning products, mosquito repellent, bottled water and underwear.

\$317,021.92 has been donated to GIVIT to be used to purchase essential items in affected regions identified by local services and outreach teams. These funds are also being used to support complex cases identified by the council's Human and Social Recovery sub-groups.

For example, upon request by City of Gold Coast, GIVIT used donated funds to purchase services for a number of Gold Coast residents, including water tank sanitisation, supplying drinking water and filling water tanks, septic tank checks and repairs, assistance with removal of debris.





## QLD



Whilst the past 12 months now feels completely dominated by the response to Cyclone Debbie, GIVIT undertook a range of other activities during 2016/17.

These included responding to needs following a number of storms in south-east Queensland including the Somerset region and Ipswich City Council areas. GIVIT also assisted in the aftermath of the Dreamworld tragedy and Cherbourg School Fire and a traumatic incident which affected the wider community in Cairns.

GIVIT ran a major Kids in Care Appeal appeal in December forging a very strong relationship with the Department of Communities, who are now funding a fulltime engagement role with GIVIT. Through this process, GIVIT also discovered a previously untapped resource, School communities, and our new Engagement Coordinator will use a portion of her time to foster this incredible cohort of generous donors to support future appeals and GIVIT's everyday operations.

GIVIT also called on the generosity and all round awesomeness of the Road Boss Rally crew to collect toys and take them to the delivery points for the appeal, which strengthened our partnership with the Rally team and generated a real sense of purpose and goodwill throughout the participating rally drivers.

Clearly it has been an enormous year for GIVIT in Oueensland!

#### **Dreamworld Appeal**



In October 2016 GIVIT assisted families of the four Dreamworld visitors who died in a ride tragedy. Donations of \$589,941.94 made by businesses and members of the Australian public were distributed via an Independent Appeal Distribution Committee which was coordinated and administered by GIVIT.

#### **Cairns Tragedy**



In October 2016 a number of people were severely injured, and one woman died after a vehicle was driven into a home. Many of those injured required weeks of medical treatment. GIVIT assisted with beds, whitegoods, air conditioners and furniture to allow the family whose home was destroyed to relocate and recover in some comfort.

## **Cherbourg Fire**



In January 2017, 1,240 items were donated following a fire which destroyed two school classroms filled with back to school supplies. Stationery, water bottles, hats, backpacks, chair bags, laminator, shredder, kitchen essentials and appliances lost in the fire were replaced.

#### S.E. Qld Storms



Dangerous thunderstorms led to an increased need for help. March 2017 was a particularly severe event which saw vulnerable residents in Somerset Regional and Ipswich City Council areas need extra support. GIVIT assisted with matching urgent need such as groceries and cleaning products.

#### **Christmas Appeal: Kids in Care**



In December 2016 GIVIT ran a major Christmas appeal resulting in over 10,000 new items being delivered to children in care throughout Queensland.

Not only did this bring a smile to so many children's faces, it also forged a very strong bond with the Department of Communities, Child Safety and Disability Services who are now funding a part-time engagement role with GIVIT.

Our new Engagement Coordinator will foster GIVIT's relationships with school communities, an incredible cohort of generous donors, to support future appeals and GIVIT's everyday operations.

GIVIT also called on the generosity and all-round awesomeness of the Road Boss Rally crew to collect toys and take them to the delivery points for the appeal, further strengthening our partnership with the rally team and generating a real sense of purpose and goodwill with the participating rally drivers.





It has been a productive 12 months in Western Australia with 3,158 donations successfully matched. Thanks to GIVIT's partnership with the Bankwest Foundation, GIVIT focussed on developing local capacity, recruiting a State Manager and training volunteers from Bankwest to assist in the management of small scale disasters.

In June 2017 Travis Fitch was appointed WA Manager following the departure of Anna Presser. Travis joins GIVIT after establishing his own charity, 12 Buckets, which continues to provide a tailored mentoring program for children deemed at-risk and disadvantaged.

GIVIT has established partnerships with key charities including Food Bank, Perth Inner City Youth Services, Breast Cancer Care WA and has hosted exhibits at both the Western Australian Council of Social Services (WACOSS) and Volunteering WA conferences. At the conclusion of the financial year, there were a total of 143 WA charities registered with GIVIT with 59 of these registering in the 2016/17 financial year. GIVIT has establishing working partnerships with local councils including seeing GIVIT embedded into local and State-wide emergency recovery mechanisms. A key element to developing these relationships has been the cooperative partnership that has been cultivated with the WA Local Government Association (WALGA). The positive results already emerging from this relationship include GIVIT obtaining a free booth at the annual WALGA conference in August 2017.


In the reporting period, GIVIT contacted 139 local councils with presentations being made to 27 Local Government Emergency Management Committees. This resulted in the first West Australian Memorandum of Understanding being

signed with the Shire of Augusta/ Margaret River and a further eight councils requesting MOUs for their consideration.

GIVIT continues to demonstrate its ability to manage large-scale corporate offers of assistance in Western Australia through its offline warehouse where donations can be tracked, split and assigned to specific areas in need.

One example was the Medjugorje Centre, a grassroots charity in Perth's Swan View, who received a small office to work out of.





Medjugorje's founder, Trevor Knuckey didn't have the resources to fitout the office with the desks, chairs and other equipment that he needed. GIVIT was able to connect Mr Knuckey with a corporate donor who was in the process of a large refurbishment and considering sending the quality furniture to landfill. With this new connection, Mr Knuckey was able to supply his Indigenous education support charity with more than what they had originally hoped for - including lockable filing cabinets and visitors chairs. Mr Knuckey, was nothing short of thrilled.

GIVIT is continuing to build a strong media profile in WA and has employed a PR consultant to increase its media exposure. This has culminated in a regular GIVIT segment on 98Five Sonshine FM as well as numerous print articles. GIVIT is thrilled to have the in-kind support of Carat Media, who have offered pro-bono services in order to assist GIVIT in the expansion of its media

presence and, in particular, a national Spring Clean Campaign.

It is anticipated that significant advancement in GIVIT's disaster recovery capacity will be demonstrated in its inclusion in the State Welfare Emergency Committee Recovery Plans, the formalisation of partnerships with local councils and ongoing training and development of volunteer teams in preparation for GIVIT being activated in WA.

2017/18 will also see GIVIT concentrate its efforts on assisting people living in more remote regions of North Western Australia; in particular, the Mid-West Gasgoyne and Pilbara. With concerning reports coming from agencies and charities about the impact of poverty and drug use in pockets of these regions, GIVIT is committed to building strong links with organisations and services whose important and dynamic community work needs the sort of practical support GIVIT is able to provide.



## **ACT**

Supported by the ACT Government's ACT NOWaste, GIVIT launched in Canberra in May 2017. To enhance GIVIT's impact and support more service providers across the Territory, a full-time ACT Manager, Caroline Odgers, has been employed.

To date, the response from local service providers has been outstanding with almost 50 service providers registering for GIVIT.

Within weeks of launching in the ACT, GIVIT was selected to be the Charity Partner for the 2017 Floriade (16 September – 15 October), which is the ACT's largest annual event attracting up to 500,000 visitors each Spring.

GIVIT will receive excellent exposure across a number of platforms including;

- a 60sqm onsite exhibition space, #DonateRejuvenate House, which will hopefully inspire the community and local businesses to donate items to those in need;
- trash-to-treasure workshops to get kids' thinking about giving items a second life;
- "The Great Waste Debate" hosted jointly by GIVIT, Events ACT and ABC Radio Canberra (the live event will be broadcast during the popular Drive program);
- an official GIVIT ACT Launch. Dinner hosted by Paul West of River Cottage Australia.

## **Road Boss Rally**

#### Ordinary people giving extraordinary support to GIVIT

This past year, we were honoured to have the support of our National Fundraiser – the Road Boss Rally (RBR). This car rally, with their incredible community of generous entrants, was integral in GIVIT achieving its core vision of matching generosity with genuine need.

In June 2016, the inaugural RBR took off from Toowoomba and headed across Australia to Perth. This cross-country feat resulted in \$252,000 being raised for GIVIT. Juliette Wright, GIVIT's Founder and CEO, said she was in disbelief at the huge donation. "I couldn't believe it when the entrants handed me a cheque for \$250,000 dollars – I actually had tears in my eyes," Juliette said.

Road Boss Rally Founder and renowned rally organiser, Jamie Lawson, said entrants are ordinary working class people who love cars, love the Australian outback and love helping other people.

"They are ordinary people doing extraordinary and extremely generous things," Mr Lawson said. "It was a wonderful experience to be able to hand over such a huge amount of money to GIVIT. Through GIVIT, thousands of charities across the country will be supported as they request essential items on behalf of their clients."

With this donation, GIVIT was able to directly support the needs of our most vulnerable Australians.

#### **Cyclone Debbie**



When Cyclone Debbie tore through Queensland's coastline earlier this year, GIVIT was able to dedicate \$50,000 of funds raised by RBR towards supporting the recovery. Urgently needed generators, pump parts and water loads were provided to support impacted communities, while beds, food vouchers, linen and fridges were delivered to devastated families.

# Ilkurlka Emergency Supplies



When RBR travelled through the remote outback Ilkurlka community in Western Australia last year, entrants learned that the town was in desperate need of emergency supplies. Through GIVIT, RBR funds were used to purchase a defibrillator and pads for children, as well as portable airstrip lighting and batteries to use in emergencies.

#### **Drought Relief**



With many Queensland communities still struggling through drought, GIVIT, together with RBR were able to provide much-needed support in Far North Queensland. Funds were spent locally, with fuel and butcher vouchers provided to local families, as well as nourishing breakfasts provided for school kids.

#### **Eulo Airstrip**



Recently we answered a call from the Eulo Development Association which had been trying for many years to secure portable landing lights for their airstrip. Through the efforts of GIVIT and RBR, the lights have been delivered to this remote outback Queensland town, and are being stored with other essential emergency response equipment. Now the Royal Flying Doctor Service can land safely at night in times of great emergency.

#### **Kids in Care**



With the incredible support of RBR, GIVIT was able to provide more than 9,000 Christmas to children living in care across Queensland. RBR entrants helped by not only generously giving toys, but also by delivering these gifts straight to Child Safety Centres across the state.

#### The 2017 Rally

Jamie Lawson said with the first RBR now under their belts and a \$250,000 benchmark set, the team is looking forward to taking on the 2017 rally and making an even greater difference.

The 2017 rally will take off from Gladstone, then travel a 5000km outback trek to Tamworth via the Boulia Camel Races. There are 60 entrants registered with cars and crews travelling from South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, New Zealand and even California in the USA.

The 2017 fundraising tally currently sits at \$121,000 and it is estimated the final donation amount will surpass \$250,000 by the time the crews make it to Tamworth on July 20. For more information visit givit.org.au/road-boss-rally.




