Queenslanders called to help donate over 9,500 gifts for foster children this Christmas

Generous Queenslanders are being called upon to donate toys to gift thousands of extra presents to fill the stockings and stack under the trees of over 9,500 children living in care this Christmas.

National online charity GIVIT is again supporting the Queensland Government, Department of Child Safety, Youth and Women, for the '2019 Kids in Care Christmas Appeal'.

Last year, GIVIT sourced and distributed 9,000 gifts for children in care in Queensland. For this coming Christmas season, GIVIT is aiming to collect and gift items for over 9,500 presents to children from Mount Isa to Toowoomba, and everywhere in between.

GIVIT's CEO Sarah Tennant said the 2019 Appeal is a chance for big-hearted Queenslanders to spread Christmas cheer to children living in care, from newborns to 17-year-olds, across the state.

"It's always tough not being with your own family at Christmas, and kids in foster care find themselves in this situation for a variety of unfortunate reasons," said Ms Tennant.

"For as little as a \$20 donation you can make a child feel special and knowing they're being thought of this Christmas. I urge anyone who is able to give to consider dropping an extra toy or a gift card into your trolley when you're shopping for your own family.

"You can also visit our website and make a cash donation which allows GIVIT to buy toys and Christmas gifts locally, supporting local businesses."

To donate to the state-wide 2019 Appeal, simply purchase a new, unwrapped gift, a gift card or make a tax-deductible cash donation at [GIVIT.org.au/kidsincare](https://givit.org.au/kidsincare). Gifts can be delivered to child safety service centres across the state until December 6 2019.

A gift valued at \$20 or more is encouraged, and suggestions include toys, gift cards, sporting equipment, board games, books or clothes for babies to teenagers.
